



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
Health- Checkup: 9th to 17th August



Today, I would like to draw your attention towards the impact of poly bags on our environs.


Plastic, unfortunately, has mingled with our everyday life and it is almost impossible to detach it from our lives. Plastic is durable and this durability is the cause of worry. Unlike paper, jute which are biodegradable; plastics are relatively inert materials and do not decompose naturally.

Disposal of plastics is still a huge problem. Up until now, a perfectly safe method of disposal of plastics has not yet worked out. In cities, the plastics which cannot be reused or recycled are moved into landfills. Another, and one of the most dangerous mode of plastic disposal is burning which aggravates breathing problems in asthmatics and release toxic waste products like dioxins into the atmosphere. A recent survey conducted by the Times of India shows that India consumes at least more than 25% as compared to the other developed countries. Plastics clog the drains and the marine life is affected adversely. Many animals die from intestinal blockage as a result of swallowing the poly bags.

The alternatives are several. After all we did manage before plastics came along and overwhelmed us. There are so many eco-friendly, biodegradable alternatives- recycled paper, cloth bags and jute bags. The need of hour is awareness. The public needs to be educated not only about the hazards of indiscriminate plastic use but also about the importance of cleanliness. DO AWAY WITH PLASTIC BAGS FOR YOUR OWN GOOD.
