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
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Zydus on the go

The students of grade 9 had gone on an **educational trip to Sardar Patel Farm, Kathwada, Ahmedabad.** The farm is located around 30kms from the school and is best known for its biodiversity. The farm is spread around 150 acres. Dr. Dinesh Patel and Jagruti Patel, the owners of the farm guided the students. The students were first taken to the Biogas plant wherein they were shown the setup of the plant and the mechanism of production of biogas which they themselves use for cooking. The students were also taken for the field visit and were amazed to see the rare collection of nursery plants, especially the different types of cactus. They had a rich collection of some of the tallest exotic trees from different countries. The students were also briefed about crop rotation and were shown the fields of paddy. The method of vegetative propagation used for growing mangoes, i.e, cleft grafting was demonstrated to the students. Then, they were taken to the processing unit wherein the commercial aspects like harvesting, segregating and packing were shown. The visit was very enriching and informative for the students. It was really a good experience and the students got practical knowledge about the agricultural practices and the biodiversity.


