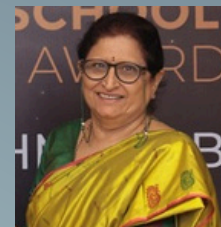

Dear All,

It gives me immense pleasure to present the first edition of ZEN 2025, our School Magazine, a publication that captures the vibrant spirit, creativity and commitment that characterize our institution. Each page of this publication is a testament to the hard work of our students and educators, who together continue to nurture a culture of learning, curiosity, and excellence.

In our school, we believe that real learning happens when students grow not only in knowledge, but also in character, self-awareness, and values. Guided by this belief, the past academic year has been a journey of progress and meaningful engagement. I am proud to share that our students have once again brought laurels to the school with their commendable performance in the Board Examinations.

In ICSE, our highest score touched an extraordinary 99.60% with 63% of our students securing 90% and above, 43 perfect 100% scores in various subjects, and the class average standing at 89%. In ISC, we witnessed brilliance across all three streams. The highest scores were 96.75% in Science and 98.5% in Commerce, while Humanities shone with a commendable 94.25%. I congratulate all students, their families, and our educators for their sincere efforts and perseverance. This success would not have been possible without our educators' unwavering efforts.

This year, we were also the proud recipients of Divya Bhaskar Award for Excellence in Academic Innovation & Teaching Excellence and the Indian School Awards (ISA) for Best School with Holistic Education. Additionally, we achieved All India Rank 57, State Rank 6 and City Rank 4 in the Education World India School Rankings. In recognition of our commitment to a clean and safe environment, we were presented with a Certificate of Appreciation by the Municipal Commissioner under the Swacch Bharat Abhiyaan – Clean Ahmedabad initiative.

Our students excelled in sports, art, cultural events, community outreach programs, and leadership initiatives – reflecting the holistic education we strive to impart. In the CISCE NWR and School Games, our students have made us proud with their achievements in sports, with several being selected to represent at the national level in Chess, Skating, Swimming, Gymnastics and Shooting (Air Pistol). Our girls' football team also qualified for the national level. Additionally, our students also bagged ₹95,000 in prize money at Khel Mahakumbh 3.0 (2024–25) by winning top positions in various sports events at the zonal and district levels.

We have also seen remarkable achievements in Science. In the state-level International Science Olympiad, Meghav Ladani won at the national level and was selected to represent both, our school and the country on an educational trip to NASA (USA).

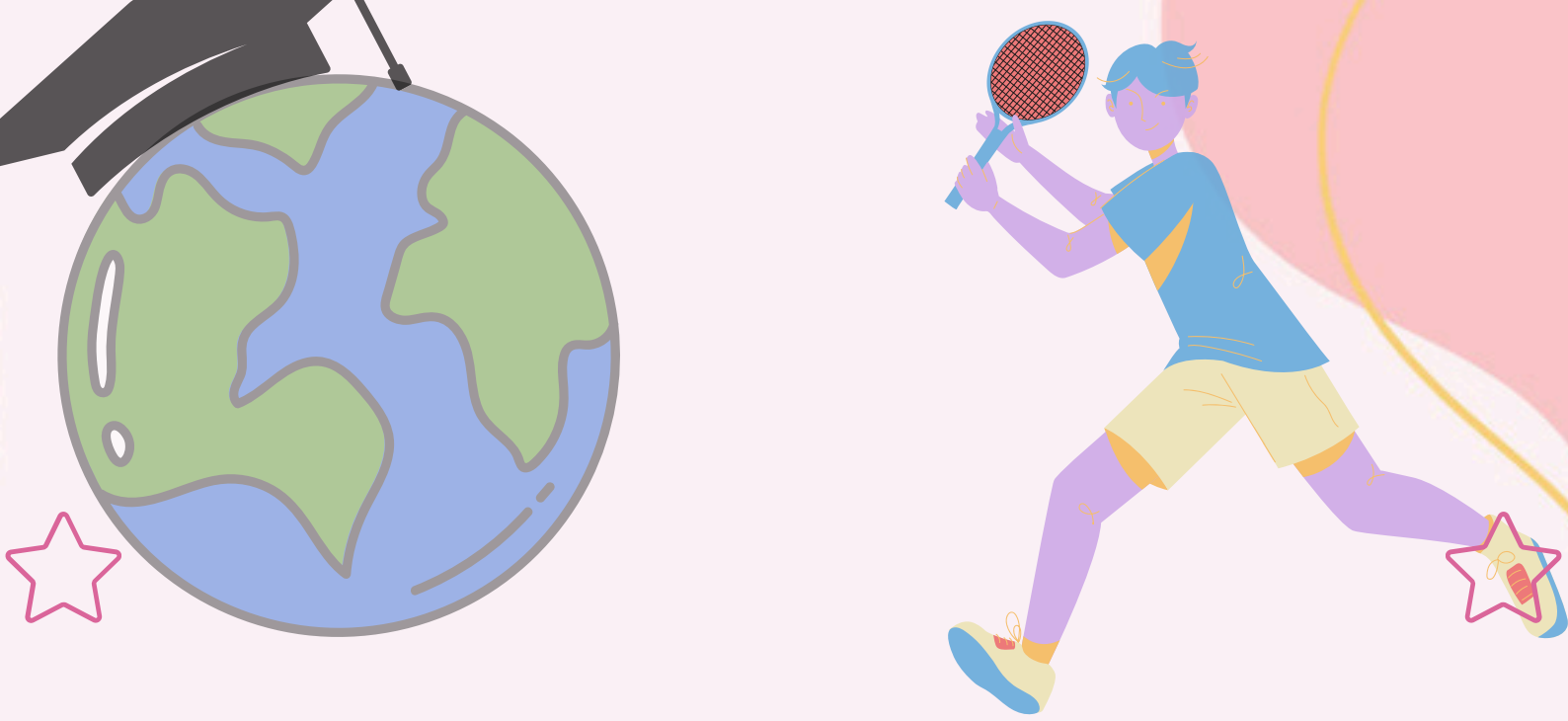
May this publication encourage all students to dream big, work hard, and contribute positively to the world. May our collective efforts lead us to greater heights.

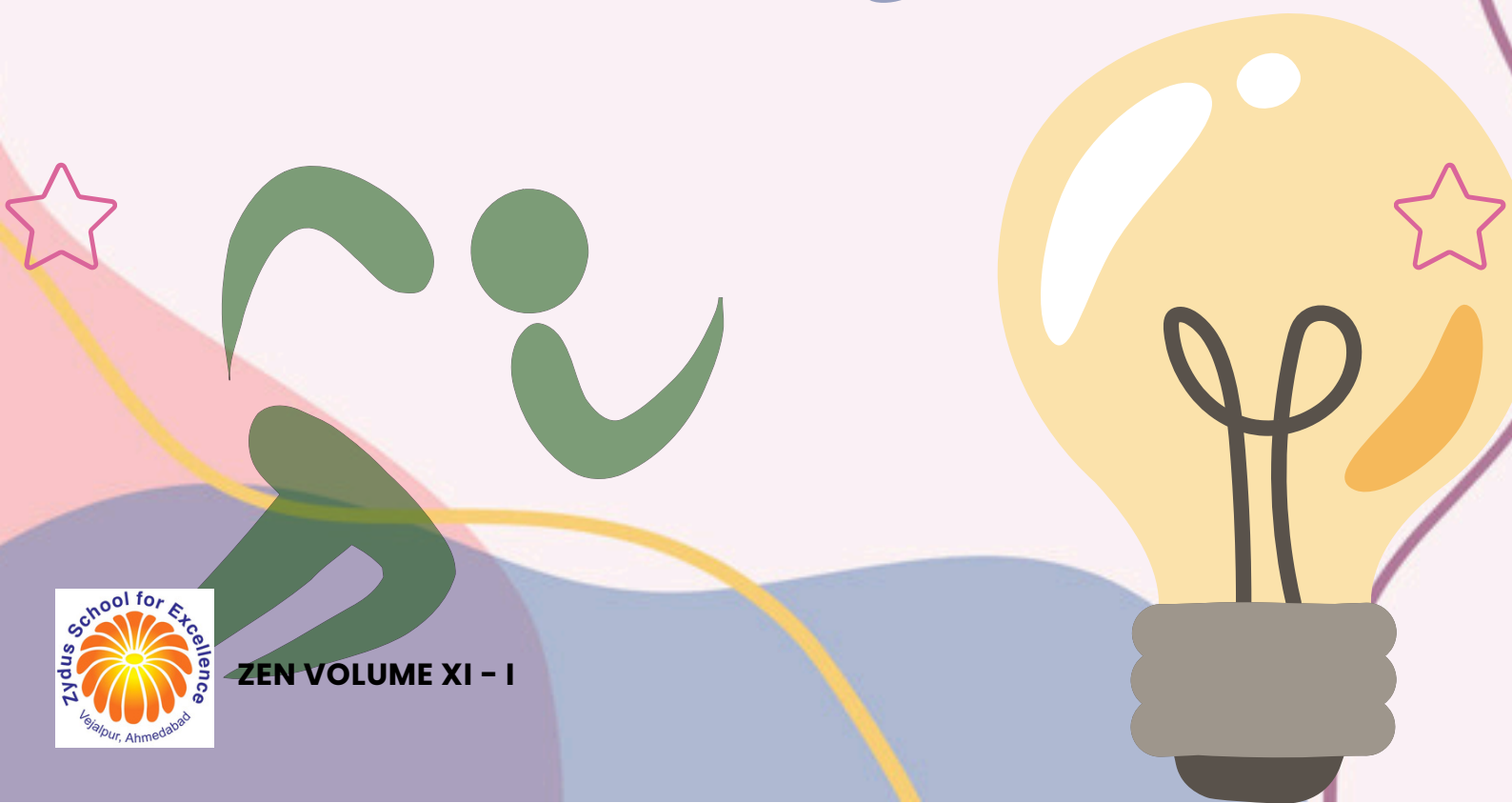

CISCE BOARD EXAMINATION RESULTS 2024-25

Stellar performance in Board Exams – Yet another year of remarkable performance

OUR STAR ACHIEVERS

Meghav Ladani: Setting New Benchmarks in Achievement

Meghav scored 99.60% and also emerged as the Gujarat state topper and the third rank holder at the National level. He secured 100% in seven subjects and earned recognition in national and international Olympiads, including an international gold medal and a cash prize of Rs. 50,000 for the International Maths Olympiad. He secured the top position in the state-level International Science Olympiad, won at the national level and was selected to represent both, our school and the country on an educational trip to NASA (USA).



Anamaya Sharma: A trailblazer in academics and beyond

Our ICSE second-ranker Anamaya, with 99%, secured 100% in five subjects and consistently excelled in Mathematics and Science, at both national and international platforms. He was selected for the prestigious Pre-College Summer School Program at Harvard University and secured a position at the national level in STEM Quiz 3.0, emerging as a top performer among over 10 lakh participants. At the Harvard Undergraduate Science Olympiad (HUSO), he achieved India Rank 1 in Earth Science, India Rank 2 in Mathematics, Physics, Biology, and Chemistry, and Overall India Rank 2, earning multiple awards and a USD 200 scholarship.

Anamaya's achievements extend beyond academics. He secured a rank at the state level in the Times of India Public Speaking competition, was declared the Regional Runner-up in the TCS Inquizitive2024 Quiz, and was adjudged Best Speaker in the senior category of the Association of Schools for the Indian School Certificate (ASISC) NWR Debate Competition. He clinched the first prize in Vigyanam – a Science Research Paper Presentation competition hosted by DPS, Bopal.

TEACHING METHODOLOGY WORKSHOP – JR. KG.

The workshop concluded with parents gaining an understanding of the school's child-centred approach and practical ideas to create a playful learning environment, thereby strengthening the essential partnership between home and school for the overall development of Jr. KG children.

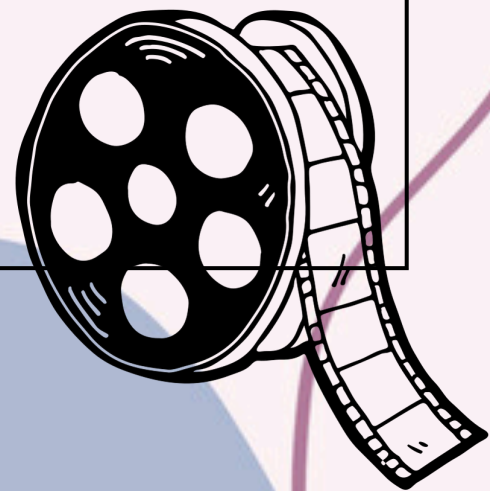

SEEDBALL DISPERSAL

BUILDING A GREENER FUTURE

ZSE, Vejalpur Champions the Green Gujarat Initiative

As part of the Green Gujarat initiative, the third phase of the Seed Ball making activity for sustaining our environment was held on 18th June 2025 for our students. The aim of this activity was to engage students in the preparation of seed balls and raise their awareness about the environment and its conservation.

Students of grades VI to VIII gained hands-on experience in making the seed balls and made around 14,000 seed balls. The slogan 'Small Changes, Big Impact' set the tone as all students, alongwith the teachers pledged to work towards a better environment by saving fuel, conserving water, and planting seeds. They were also encouraged to raise awareness among those around them. These balls of seeds and compost were dispersed at various locations in the forest, where they will eventually germinate and grow, contributing to the restoration of flora and fauna. It sensitised children to care for the environment, encouraging them to plant more trees and protect nature.

The event was facilitated by Dr. Binita Verdia, Head – Corporate Social Responsibility, Zydus Lifesciences, who emphasised the significance of making the seedballs for environmental preservation. The students actively participated and expressed their joy in being part of the initiative. A lucky draw was also held, where winners received sustainable bags, and each student was presented with a certificate and an eco-friendly pen.

SMALL ACTS. BIG IMPACT

SUGAR BOARD SESSION

A special assembly for students of grades I to V was conducted to raise awareness about the ill-effects of excessive sugar consumption, offering an informative and interactive platform to guide young learners toward healthier dietary choices. Students were taught about the harmful consequences of consuming sugary foods beyond recommended limits and were introduced to the various commercial names of sugar commonly found on food labels, with a strong emphasis on reading ingredient lists carefully. The session also highlighted lifestyle-related health issues such as Type-II diabetes and childhood obesity, encouraging children to adopt healthier eating habits by exploring nutritious alternatives to sugary snacks. The assembly concluded with all students taking a pledge to reduce their daily sugar intake, reinforcing their commitment to a healthier lifestyle.



ASISC NWR COMPETITION

The ASISC North West Region Competition 2025 was hosted by our school, bringing together participants who had qualified through their respective zones to compete at the regional level, with five senior teams and three junior teams taking part. The Senior Category was judged by Ms. Jean Dsouza, a dual Ph.D. holder in English literature and professor specializing in biblical and Indian literary studies, and Mr. Pradeep Malik, Ph.D., professor of Mass Communication and former Head of Languages, Literature & Aesthetics at Pandit Deendayal Energy University.

The Junior Category was evaluated by Ms. Vranda Rathi, a creativity trainer and storyteller with over 25 years of experience and founder of Vranda Arts, along with Ms. Ruhee Parelkar, a literature scholar, Trinity-certified trainer, and Teaching Associate at CEPT University. The topics were "Should war be justified to safeguard human rights and freedom?" for the Senior Category and "The rise of coaching classes and private tutoring has drastically reduced the purpose of holistic education" for the Junior Category.

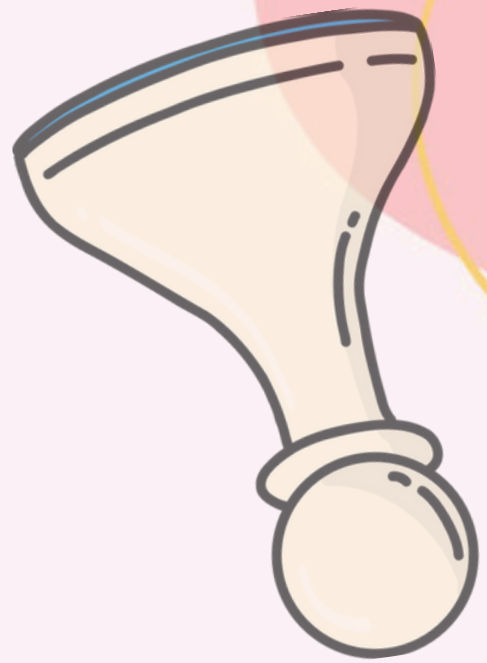
A Celebration of Culture, Values and Togetherness

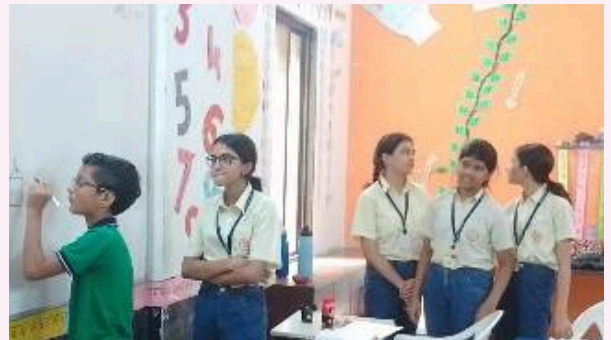

शिक्षक वह कहलाते हैं।

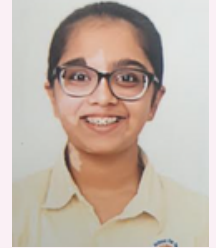

– “To convert light energy into chemical energy”. Why?

– And so on...

2. Connect the Dots

Try to link what you are learning to things you already know or care about. Studying the Roman Empire? Think about how their engineering principles still influence modern architecture. Learning about percentages in math? Connect it to understanding statistics in your favourite sport.

3. Embrace “I Don’t Know”

Those three words aren’t a failure – they are an invitation to explore. Every time you say “I don’t know”, follow it with “but I’d like to find out”. This simple shift transforms confusion into opportunity.

4. Question Authority (Respectfully)

Don’t just accept information because a textbook or teacher says it’s true. Ask for evidence, examples and explanations. Good teachers love curious students who push for deeper understanding. Remember these following things Every expert in every field was once a beginner who asked good questions. Every breakthrough was made by someone who wondered “What if things could be different?”. Your curiosity isn’t just a tool for getting good grades – its your pathway to becoming the person you want to be and making the contributions to the world that only you can make. So go ahead, be curious. Ask those questions. What questions will you ask today?

The Unseen Curriculum: How Literature Forges Leaders with Soul

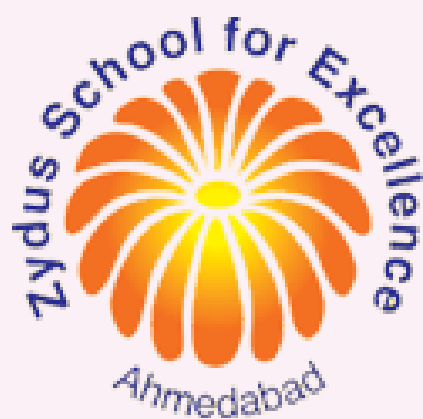
